


1. Metaphors that Communicate Redemption:



- **Redemption** the presence of God, the place (land), and the people of God (Rev. 21:3).
- **Metaphor** –"The essence of metaphor is <u>understanding</u> and <u>experiencing</u> one kind of thing in terms of another."

2. Redemption as Marriage:

• Exodus 6:6-7 – the four expressions of redemption.

I will bring (צא') you out	- to be moved or "brought out" of a location
I will deliver (rescue) (נצל) you	- to rescue, but it doesn't imply an ongoing relationship
I will redeem (גאל) you	- doing the part as a kinsman to redeem from difficulty or distress.
. , , ,	Restoring to the rightful place of a household (father's house).
I will take (לקח) you as my own	- to "take" as in a marriage

- Four Cups of Wine at a Passover are based on the four expressions of redemption:
 - o Cup of Sanctification bring out
 - o Cup of Deliverance deliver
 - Cup of Redemption redeem (see Luke 22:20 Jesus uses the 3rd cup to establish his covenant as the kinsman-redeemer.
 - o Cup of Restoration (Consummation) take you as my own.

3. Biblical Examples:

- Ezekiel 16 see v. 8.
- Hosea 1:2 "go take in marriage (לקח) a promiscuous woman."
- Isaiah 54:5 (NIV) "for your Maker is your husband."
- Jeremiah 2:2 (NIV) "I remember the devotion of your youth, how as a bride you loved me."

A New Covenant – Jesus as the Bridegroom Marriage as a Metaphor for Redemption Exodus 20-24

4. 1st Century Marriage in Two Parts -

Approx. 1 Year	
Betrothal (Matt. 1:18)	Wedding ceremony
Marriage Contract	Consummation (completion)
Officially married but not living together	

5. Confirm Your Oath to the Marriage Contract:

- Female is not obligated she may choose freely (Gen. 24:57-59)
- Affirm your oath to the marriage contract through a shared cup of wine.
- Accepting the cup of wine signifies "I do," and you are not to violate the marriage contract.²

6. Engagement Period:

• The bridegroom prepares a room in the Father's house during the engagement period.

7. New Testament Message of Redemption through a Marriage Metaphor:

- Matt. 26:28 "my blood of the covenant."
- Luke 22:20 Jesus comments at the 3rd cup after the meal.
 - o This is the Cup of Redemption.
- Sharing a cup of wine also represents a betrothal ceremony!

8. Symbolism of the Eucharist:

- Each time we drink the wine, we are reenacting two symbols:
 - O Covenant Ratification Ceremony to affirm our commitment to the covenant.
 - o We say "I do" to our bridegroom. We reaffirm our wedding vows.

9. Symbols of Redemption:

- **John 14:1-3** we wait as our bridegroom prepares a room for us in the Father's house.
- **John 14:23** redemption language of making "our home with them."
- **Revelation 21:9** Bride of the Lamb.
