

Notes Parable: Rich Man and Lazarus Luke 16:19-31

The Priests in Jesus day were wealthy – often at the expense of those they were supposed to be protecting

The name Lazarus is a Greek variant on the Hebrew name Eliezer, Abrahams servant (Gen. 15:2).

Eliezer, a gentile, ends up with the inheritance of Abraham's blessing.

The Sadducees – the Priests and the Levites – did not believe in the afterlife, nor justice in the afterlife. They said, "all justice is meted out in this lifetime."

The Sadducees – only accepted the Torah (Genesis – Deuteronomy) as God's word. They did not accept the Prophets – which speak of resurrection (Dan. 12:2).

The Sadducees – did not believe in the resurrection of the dead (Acts 23:6). <sup>19</sup> "There was a <u>rich man</u> who was dressed in <u>purple</u> and <u>fine linen</u> and <u>lived in luxury every day</u>. <sup>20</sup> At his gate was laid a beggar named <u>Lazarus</u>, covered with <u>sores</u> <sup>21</sup> and longing to eat what fell from the rich man's table. Even the <u>dogs came and licked his sores</u>.

<sup>22</sup> "The time came when the beggar died, and the angels carried him to <u>Abraham's side</u>. The rich man also died and was buried. <sup>23</sup> In Hades, where he was in torment, he looked up and saw Abraham far away, with Lazarus by his side. <sup>24</sup> So he called to him, 'Father Abraham, have pity on me and <u>send Lazarus</u> to dip the tip of his finger in water and cool my tongue, because I am in agony in this fire.'

<sup>25</sup> "But Abraham replied, '<u>Son</u>, remember that <u>in your lifetime you</u> <u>received your good things</u>, while Lazarus received bad things, but now he is comforted here and you are in agony. <sup>26</sup> And besides all this, between us and you a great chasm has been set in place, so that those who want to go from here to you cannot, nor can anyone cross over from there to us.'

<sup>27</sup> "He answered, "Then I beg you, father, send Lazarus to my family, <sup>28</sup> for <u>I have five brothers</u>. Let him warn them, so that they will not also come to this place of torment.'

<sup>29</sup> "Abraham replied, 'They have <u>Moses and the Prophets</u>; let them listen to them.'

<sup>30</sup> "No, Father Abraham,' he said, 'but if <u>someone from the dead</u> goes to them, they will repent.'

<sup>31</sup> "He said to him, 'If they do not listen to Moses and the Prophets, they will not be convinced even if someone <u>rises from the dead.</u>""

Exodus 28:5 Priestly Garments

The dogs had more compassion than the "rich man." Dogs were used for medicinal purposes in the ancient Near East.

"Abraham's bosom" indicates the 2<sup>nd</sup> guest of honor at the heavenly banquet. See: Isaiah 25:6-8; Matt. 8:11-12; Luke 13:28-30.

The High Priest Annas (Luke 3:2) served from 6 AD to 15 AD. Annas had (5) sons and (1) sonin-law, Caiaphas.

Caiaphas served as High Priest from 18 AD – 36 AD. Although Caiaphas was the "official" High Priest – his father-in-law Annas held power behind the scenes (John 18:13).

Levi – son of Jacob – also has five brothers from the same mother, Leah (Genesis 35:23).
