1. <b>Passover</b> Pesach	Exodus 12:14 Leviticus 23:5 Deuteronomy 16	14 <sup>th</sup> of Nisan (1 <sup>st</sup> Month)	Celebrate how God delivered His people from bondage in Egypt.
2. <b>Feast of Unleavened Bread</b>  "Chag Ha Matzot"	Exodus 12:17 Leviticus 23:6 Deuteronomy 16	15 <sup>th</sup> of Nisan (1 <sup>st</sup> Month)	On way out of Egypt, no leaven in the bread.
3. <b>Feast of First Fruits</b>  "Chag Ha Bikkumim"	Leviticus 23:11 Deuteronomy 16	"Day after the Sabbath"	To 'Celebrate' once they get to the 'Promised Land'
4. <b>Feast of Weeks</b> "Shavuot" "Pentecost"	Leviticus 23: 15-16 Deuteronomy 16:9	"Count" <b>7 Sabbaths</b> or "count <b>50 days</b> " from <b>First Fruits</b>	Celebrate the Wheat Harvest A Thanksgiving Feast
5. <b>Feast of Trumpets</b>  "Rosh Hashana"	Leviticus 23: 24 Deuteronomy 16:9	1 <sup>st</sup> of Tishri (7 <sup>th</sup> Month)	Call to Judgment
6. <b>Day of Atonement</b>  "Yom Kippor"	Leviticus 23: 26	10 <sup>th</sup> of Tishri (7 <sup>th</sup> Month)	Atonement for Sins
7. <b>Feast of Tabernacles</b>  "Sukkot"	Leviticus 23: 34 Deuteronomy 16:13	15 <sup>th</sup> of Tishri (7 <sup>th</sup> Month)	A Thanksgiving Feast
